

Eligibility criteria for sacral nerve stimulation (SNS) for faecal incontinence

Southern Cross will only reimburse the cost of sacral nerve stimulation (SNS) under a member's policy to treat faecal incontinence and only when criteria **1**, **2**, **3**, **4** and **5** below are met for that member.

- 1. Conservative medical treatment has failed, is contraindicated, or is not tolerated.
- 2. Sphincter surgery is contraindicated or not indicated.
- 3. There is no evidence of **any** of the following:
 - a significant anorectal malformation (eg a major sphincter defect of over 50%)
 - rectal prolapse
 - fistula
 - perineal deformity.
- 4. There is no active bowel disease causing faecal incontinence.
- **5.** There is at least a 50% improvement in reported symptoms following placement of neurostimulator electrodes and temporary implantable device for test stimulation.

The cost of the sacral nerve stimulation to treat faecal incontinence will **not** be reimbursed in the following circumstance:

• when faecal incontinence is secondary to a neurological condition such as peripheral neuropathy or complete spinal cord injury.

Note: The cost of the battery-driven implantable device is not covered, in line with the standard Southern Cross policy exclusions.

- Congenital conditions
- Cosmetic treatment/procedures
- Health screening
- Treatment of any condition not detrimental to health
- Unapproved healthcare services.
